Charismatic refers to the gifts, or charisms, mentioned in the Bible. These gifts are given by the Holy Spirit for the purpose of building up the Body of Christ, for building up the Church.

The charismatic renewal has become an important aspect of the Catholic Church.

Speaking to the International Conference on the Catholic Charismatic Renewal on May 19th 1975, Pope Paul VI encouraged the attendees in their renewal efforts and especially to remain anchored in the Church.

On December 11, 1979, Pope John Paul II said: 'I am convinced that the charismatic renewal is a very important component of the entire renewal of the church'.

In his homily on Pentecost Sunday, May 14th, 1989, Pope John Paul II said: "I earnestly exhort you to generously open your mind and heart to receive a large outpouring of the Holy Spirit. May a new Pentecost descend upon you so that each of you might become spiritually renewed and continue on a new road of evangelical witness"

Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, when Prefect for the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith wrote 'At the heart of a world imbued with a rationalistic scepticism, a new experience of the Holy Spirit suddenly burst forth. And, since then, that experience has assumed a breadth of a worldwide Renewal movement. What the New Testament tells us about the charisms - which were seen as visible signs of the coming of the Spirit - is not just ancient history, over and done with, for it is once again becoming extremely topical.'
